

MARTIN KELLY DIES IN VALPARAISO; WAS FORMER OTTAWAN

GRANDFATHER OF LA SALLE
COUNTY STATE'S ATTORNEY
PASSES AWAY AFTER A TWO
WEEKS' ILLNESS.

Ottawans were grief stricken this morning to hear of the death of Martin Kelly, of Valparaiso, Ind., formerly of Ottawa, who passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. David Finnegan, after a short illness of two weeks.

Mr. Kelly was one of Ottawa's oldest and best known citizens having resided here continually until the last five years. During that time he has traveled considerably, but has been in Ottawa many times recently. He was born in Ottawa November 20, 1840, being 83 years of age.

To mourn his death he leaves the following children: Mrs. R. M. Halligan, of this city; Mrs. John F. Golden, of Chicago; Mrs. D. J. Finnegan, of Valparaiso, Ind.; George Kelly, of Aberdeen, S. D.; and Henry M. Kelly, former Ottawa attorney, now of Detroit. He also leaves three sisters, Mrs. M. J. Finn, Mrs. DeForrest Smith, and Mrs. John Bailey, of Chicago; also thirty-two grandchildren and eight great grandchildren. He is the grandfather of State's Attorney Harry F. Kelly.

The body will arrive in Ottawa tomorrow evening at 7:30 over the Rock Island and will be taken to the home of Richard Halligan, at 620 E. Superior street.

Funeral services will be held from St. Columba church at 9 o'clock Monday morning. Burial will be made in St. Columba cemetery.
